At the end of the CLEA Law Students Conference it is hoped to establish a Commonwealth Law Students Association or a Network of Commonwealth Law Student Societies. THEMES OF THE CLEA LAW STUDENTS CONFERENCE

The CLEA Law Students Conference will mirror the themes of the Main CLEA Conference which are the following:

1. *Legal Education and Regional Cooperation in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries*
This will enable participants to share their experiences in, or future hopes for, regional cooperation in legal education in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries.
2. *Legal education (including clinical legal education) in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries*
This is a general topic that will enable participants to discuss a broad range of contemporary legal education issues in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries.
3. *Encouraging human rights teaching in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries*
This will enable participants to reflect on how human rights can be taught in both Commonwealth and other Common law country law schools.
4. *Preventing corruption and the misuse of public office: How can law teachers assist in fighting the scourge of corruption in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries?*
This will encourage law students to reflect on how anti-corruption measures can be taught in Commonwealth and other Common law country law schools.
5. *Islamic law in the curricula of Commonwealth and other Common law country law schools*
This will allow law students involved in Islamic Law courses in law schools in the Commonwealth and other Common law countries to exchange ideas on how the courses are and should be taught.
